## **Inclusion**



Effective inclusion starts with high quality teaching and we a strong track record of challenging and nurturing every child's needs so that they fulfil their potential.

Our aim is for every child to have access to all aspects of school life. We therefore make all reasonable adjustments to ensure that pupils with specific needs or disabilities are not placed at disadvantage and we will know that we have succeeded when they are participating fully in school life. This may include allocation of additional funds, purchasing additional books and equipment and appropriate training for teaching and support staff.

Teachers monitor children's progress very carefully and will personalise children's learning to meet their needs. Any concerns are discussed with parents and the Inclusion co-ordinator. Additional advice, assessment or support may be requested from the Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapists or the Local Authority Pupil Support Services. Children's progress is continuously monitored and the level of support they receive reflects their changing needs.

The SEN Code of Practice has a graduated approach to help pupils with special educational needs. The approach recognises that there is a continuum of needs. The class teacher continually assesses the progress of all pupils. A pupil is considered to have special educational needs when the class teacher has to provide tasks that are significantly different from those provided as part of the school's differentiated curriculum.
