

Clubs, Visits and Visitors



We run a breakfast club from 8am at a cost of £2 per day per child. No need to book, just turn up. It is staffed by two Teaching Assistants and children are offered a selection of breakfast items to choose from, including toast, yoghurt, fruit, cereal and juice.

The school encourages children to get involved in extra-curricular activities. Clubs are run during lunchtimes and after school. These include sport, dance and music activities. Clubs vary according to take up and the season. Details of our current clubs can be found on our website or by contacting the school office.

Outside visits in connection with the topics children are learning about in school make a valuable contribution to learning. These include visits to museums and to the theatre.

Visits from drama groups and people from the community also help to widen the children's experience. A residential visit is organised bi-annually with another village school for Years 5 & 6, which gives the children a valuable experience of a wide range of exciting activities with their friends.

Although there is no obligation for parents to contribute to the cost of visits it would be difficult for many of them to go ahead without your financial support.

Children are given the opportunity to attend a range of clubs and can participate in the choir, or basketball, football, breakfast, recorder or homework club. Most clubs take place after school.
