

Attendance



School attendance is a legal requirement.

It is of vital importance that your child attends regularly and is on time. This is one of the most effective ways you can support your child's education and help them to make good progress.

Children who miss a lot of school or who are consistently late are at a disadvantage. Children arriving late not only miss vital elements of learning but also disrupt the class. It is also very important for your child's security that he or she is collected on time at the end of the day.

Should your child be absent we ask that you contact the school by 10am on the first day, giving a reason. A representative of the school will call you if we do not hear from you.

Should your child be unwell, as a general rule, if you are not sure how unwell your child is, we encourage you to bring them to school and trust us to take care of them. We will call you if they don't improve.

Please note parents are expected to take holidays in school holiday times to avoid disruption to learning.

We monitor absence and lateness very closely, working with the Education Welfare Service.

Please note that it is a Government priority to ensure that every child attends school regularly. Under the **Education Act 1996**, Cambridgeshire County Council has a statutory duty to take enforcement action to ensure regular school attendance. You may be subject to a Formal Warning, Penalty Notice or face prosecution if your child's attendance is deemed unsatisfactory.
